TO THE STUDENT: The new required companion course for all prospective Spanish majors and minors will be **SPAN 100: Intermediate Grammar and Composition**. [Please be aware that SPAN 100 is currently being offered both in the summer and during the regular academic year.] Upon successful completion of SPAN 100, you will be able to take any course that has SPAN 200 as a prerequisite (you will NOT take SPAN 200).

Nota bene: Given the nature of the courses and our goals in the Intermediate Program, we are assuming not only that you have a sincere interest in learning Spanish, but also that you will be dedicated to mastering and memorizing the vocabulary, terms, and concepts as we progress (this includes anything that you have not studied for whatever reason in previous courses). Again, the pace and level of complexity of the courses in the Intermediate Program will perhaps require that you spend more time studying that you might have needed to spend in previous courses. This will be especially true as the semester advances and the material becomes more complex, and as we examine more sophisticated uses of the language. Please remember: This is a vocabulary-driven course and in order to be successful and keep up you will be required to memorize new words and expressions on a daily basis!

Any student who will have completed 100 and 110 or 100 and 200 by the end of this semester is advised to do the following for Spring 2009: If you are planning a Spanish <u>major</u>, you are required to take SPAN 253 (Introduction to Literature) AND SPAN 215 (Introduction to Linguistics). These are the next two courses you should register for. They may be taken concurrently or in separate semesters. If you are planning a Spanish <u>minor</u>, you are required to take EITHER SPAN 253 (Introduction to Literature) OR SPAN 215 (Introduction to Linguistics). You may, however, take both, if you wish. The following courses, which presently have a prerequisite of 200 may also be taken by any student who has completed either sequence (100 and 200) or (100 and 110): SPAN 210, 220, or 300.

> DESCRIPTION:

- **EXAMS**: You will take five (5) in-class exams. More detailed information about the format and content will be made available well in advance of each exam, but the activities will reflect the types of exercises done in and out of class. The dates of the exams are on the syllabus. No make-ups will be allowed without valid documentation.
- FINAL ORAL EXAM: The last exam in this course will be a 5-10 minute long one-on-one oral exam. Your instructor will give you a list of topics to prepare and the exam will consist of a conversation between the instructor and the student. Note that the topics you will be asked to prepare will be based on the main thematic units of the chapters we cover throughout the course. The grading criteria used to evaluate can be found below.
- ESCENAS: You will be asked to do several short formal presentations. These might require outside preparation and that you meet with other members of your group to practice. The dates can be found on the syllabus. More information will be given as the dates approach. Video recordings are sometimes part of the oral presentations category. Class attendance during oral presentations is mandatory (Check participation)
- PARTICIPATION: You will be evaluated every week by your instructor. As this is a conversation course, it is crucial that you attend class each and every day, that you prepare thoroughly prior to coming to class, and that you participate actively. You must use Spanish to learn Spanish, so again, <u>daily attendance and active participation are expected and required</u>. Please understand that if you are not in class, your instructor will not grant you participation points for that day even if you have a valid excuse.
- A-5) student was present & prepared all week, participated actively, had positive impact on the class, spoke entirely in Spanish
- B-4) student was present and prepared, participated in group activities only, spoke mostly in Spanish
- C-3) student was present but not actively engaged, underprepared for class, spoke in English as much as Spanish

The student will be allowed TWO absences. After the second absence, each absence will result in a deduction of 2% points from the final grade. Being <u>late</u> to class repeatedly (three times) will also be counted as an absence. Please use your absences wisely. Please be seated and ready to begin when the class starts. Please remember to turn off your phone prior to the start of each class. If during class you use the text messaging service on your cell phone, read the newspaper, do crossword puzzles, etc., you will receive a two (D) for that day. If you must leave early, or if you know you will miss a day of class, please inform your instructor ahead of time if at all possible and contact a fellow student to see what you missed. Please keep in mind that attendance during the presentations is <u>mandatory</u>. A substantial penalty (-2%) will apply if you miss a class on <u>any</u> of the presentation days without a valid excuse and documentation.

- AUTO-GRABACIONES / SELF-RECORDINGS: To complete the "Auto-grabación," you will listen to, practice, and then record yourself reading the *Conversación creadora* in each chapter that we study. You have to listen to the audio cd's that contain the *Conversación creadora* dialogue before recording your own voice in order to get good results. The purpose of this is to help you to be able to better hear, understand, and produce Spanish sounds. You will record yourself using an IPOD that you may check out from 26 Willard (in the basement). Once you have recorded the conversation, you will submit it to your instructor as an attachment via email or in a dropbox in ANGEL. The due dates are shown on the syllabus. NOTE: If you return the IPOD late you might be subject to a fine. The grading criteria used for these assignments can be found below.
- HOMEWORK: The homework grade will consist of a variety of activities including—but not limited to—reading and answering follow-up questions, doing short writing assignments, completing vocabulary-based or grammar-based activities (in ANGEL and on paper), translating or creating dialogues, etc. These assignments will be announced in advance and will be due on the day your instructor asks for them. All the assignments must be typed in Font Times New Roman size 11, doubled spaced and printed on a sheet of paper that you have to give to your

instructor in the scheduled day during class time. Hand written homework will not be accepted. As always, no late work will be accepted without documentation.

■ REACTION PAPERS: You will be asked to fill out two reaction papers after we watch two in class films this semester. These are to be typed and submitted the class period after we discuss the film. The dates are listed on the syllabus. If for some reason you must miss a class on a day we show a movie, you must rent or check the film out of Pattee and watch the part you missed. A copy will also be placed on reserve in Pattee (2nd floor) the day we finish showing the film.
